Basic Rules for Chemical Spraying

If the chosen method is chemical spraying then the basic rules apply:

Permits Check to see if a permit is required from the Government

agency to carry out spraying or spraying near protected

areas.

Observe the weather conditions Check that rainfall is not forecasted. There is no point

spraying if it is too windy as there is a likelihood of spray drift which could affect non target vegetation. If the humidity is very high it can extend the droplet life.

Area to be sprayedMake sure that precautions are in place to prevent spray

drift. Also calculate or take photos of the area to be sprayed to monitor the effectiveness of spraying

chemicals.

Read the Chemical LabelRead and understand the label and booklet if one is

provided with the chemical. These should be read before commencing the weed management control program. It is essential that the correct chemical is used and the one that has the least toxic effect on the environment and the

person applying it.

PPE should be worn before proceeding to the next step.

The application rate must be measured and mixed correctly in a well-ventilated area. The supervisor should prepare the chemical. If a spill occurs use a 'spill kit' to clean away the chemical immediately. The chemical container should be locked away before commencing

spraying activities.

Post spraying After spraying, the equipment should be rinsed in the

area designated for cleaning of chemicals, allowed to dry and then stored correctly where it belongs. The Safety Data Sheet provides details of how to dispose, clean and store of the chemical product. Also study the

label for instructions.

Carry out visual observation frequently to monitor

the effectiveness of the chemical application.

Recording details A record of the application should be written in the Chemical

Application form. If any incidents occurred an incident identification form should be completed as per enterprise requirements. Photographic evidence is a very good tool to

use to record before and after displays.
