Capital letters

Capital letters mark sentence beginnings, and follow a full stop.

Example:

The day dawned bright and clear.

Names of people, places (proper nouns), and titles have capital letters.

Examples:

- 1. Rose, Jake, Ruby and Sam arrived together at Ross River. (Rose, Jake, Roby and Sam are person's names proper nouns; Ross River is the name of a geographical feature also a proper noun)
- 2. Jerry watched **Today Tonight** on television. (Today Tonight is a proper name the name of a television show).
- 3. **Grandmother Kate** came to stay. (Where the grandmother is **named**, capitals are used, but in the case: My *Grandmother came to stay* 'grandmother' does not have a capital as she is not named).

Capitals can also be used for emphasis in a text.

Example:

At the palace she saw the QUEEN!
