Review Questions for an IEP

Here are some questions that could be asked during a review of an Individual Education Plan:

- Is the IEP still an accurate reflection of the student's needs or have the student's needs changed?
- How effective are the strategies being used to support the students learning? Should changes be made?
- How effective are the resources being used to support the students learning? Should alternate resources be used?
- How much progress has the student made towards achieving the goals and meeting the expectations set out in the IEP?
- Is there any new information that will impact on the student's program, goals or strategies to be used? How will this additional information be gathered?
- Should new goals be selected and expectations constructed that could more accurately reflect the student's changing needs, capacity and interests?
- Is the student demonstrating a sense of responsibility for their learning?
- Is the student's family and home life supporting and reinforcing the goals and expectations as set out in the plan?
- Is the student responding positively to the plan and its strategies?
- Is the plan addressing the student needs effectively?
- Are the existing staff members capable of continuing to meet the child's needs?
- Are the roles, responsibilities and accountabilities of all concerned outlined in the plan?
- Are the timeframes provided appropriate and realistic?
- What can be done to improve the IEP?
