Bronchiolitis	A viral respiratory infection where airways become inflamed and feel with mucous. It affects the function of the lungs. It is contagious and passes via coughing, sneezing and direct contact (e.g. Handling used tissues). Chickenpox (Varicella-zoster virus)	A highly contagious virus spread through direct contact with person or lesion (i.e. Open wound) or from droplets spread from coughing or sneezing. Conjunctivitis	An inflammation of the membranes in the eye. It is highly contagious and can be passed via hand to eye contact or via cloth to cloth contact. Croup	A viral illness causing acute inflammation of the upper respiratory tract. Commonly affects young babies and children. Involves airways becoming swollen and narrow. Ear infection	Usually a viral infection with occasional secondary bacterial infections. Often follows a cold. Inflammation of the lining of the middle ear is common.	Ear painfeverirritabilityloss of appetite
Fever	This can be caused by a viral or bacterial infection. Occasionally follows routine immunisations.	High temperature. i.e. over 39°Cfeels hot to touchshivering or feeling very hot

Meningococcal meningitis	A highly contagious, life-threatening acute bacterial infection. Involves inflammation of the spinal cord and brain. Passed by coughing, sneezing, kissing, sharing drinks and food. Thread worm	A parasitic infestation: infection occurs after ingesting a pin worm egg. Worm eggs can survive outside the body for up to 14 days usually in dirt or dust.	 Itchy bottom loss of appetite or fussy eating worms may be visible in stools or from the anus at night

Tonsillitis	An infection or inflammation of the tonsils. Spread through the air in droplets when an infected person breathes, coughs or sneezes. Whooping cough (Pertussis)	A bacterial infection that is highly contagious to an un-immunised child. It is spread via sneezing, coughing and direct contact.
